a. Spotlight on Books

This event has lost money for two years and NLLN, as the fiscal authority, has reimbursed Joan Larson for overages that she has put on her credit card. NLLN is closing this line item in our budget and this change this will be noted in the audit. Due to a dwindling attendance, Spotlight will be discontinued and Kathy will meet with Joan in October to finalize the change.

b. Research article

The article researched and written by Kathy and Glenn defining the role of a media specialist in schools is completed and will be submitted to professional journals. An executive summary and accompanying powerpoint will be prepared in order to use the information for presentations to school-related groups.

c. Review Fiscal Year 2016 Report of Results

Some highlights:

- i. Interlibrary support for Viking Library System and bookmobile service to Campbell School.
- ii. Library Luncheon with Legislators to inform local representatives with information about library issues.
- iii. Outreach to support libraries in the region: Campbell-Tintah School, Laporte School, Bemidji Middle School, Tribal College Library Directors, Zion Lutheran Church Library, The Christiansen Librar at Lutheran Brethren Seminary, St. Joseph's School Library.
- iv. Research article detailing skills taught to student by media specialists.
- v. Overdrive School Initiative provide financial support to the Northwest Regional Library System and the Lake Agassiz Regional Library System to provide juvenile and young adult e-books
- vi. Provide Destiny training opportunities

7. New Business.

a. Reports from NLLN Board members

Northwest and Lake Agassiz systems are considering sharing their Overdrive collections; Northwest's new delivery truck (Clifford the Big Red Van) has been driven in several parades in the region. CRPSLA, the organization representing all of the twelve regional library systems, is preparing legislation to increase funding and change the formula to account for equity for allotment of state funds to the local regions. Superintendents who wish to hire media specialists express frustration that there is a lack of certified people to hire. In the Traverse de Sioux region, the public library sought to work within the school and encountered difficulties.
