**Minnesota Literacy Initiative a. Continuing Education and Professional Development Scholarships -**Education committee met 9/25/13: Jenna, Tammy, Kathy - recommends changing "Scholarship Committee" to "Education Committee"; add to the Professional Engagement Award Guidelines that professional engagement awards encompass opportunities to support library professionals in the region who wish to attend national and international conferences who may not be able to attend without the support of NLLN; and merge budget items 6022 and 6011, Professional Engagement and Scholarships, into one fund, Educational Support, making it a Committed Fund Balance that continues from year-to-year. NDSU to tabulate and report the results. NLLN also presented a discussion of the Pew Institute paper, *Younger Americans Reading and Library Habits*.
